Behaviour

As part of our focus on therapeutic approach staff have worked on our behaviour plan in school.

Our school rules are linked to Ready, Respectful and Safe, and specific positive rules that sit under these.

We have also looked at our sanctions so that staff and children are clear on the consequences of not adhering to these rules whilst protecting children's self-esteem and allowing them time to talk through how they can do things differently.

I am currently updating our policy and creating a leaflet so that we can share this with parents.

You asked...we did...

We are pleased to announce that we have found a cricket coach to run an ASC in the Summer term!

Huge thanks go to Richard Cooper who has connected up our outside classroom with power. We are now able to run a lunchtime drawing/ craft / chess / reading club which the children asked for!

Lunchtime play

From next week, the children are welcome to put their waterproof trousers on and change into their wellies at lunchtime so that we can once again access the field.

We would welcome your support by encouraging your child to practise putting their own shoes on and off, and doing their zip up on their coat.

Parking

All schools experience issues with parking and sadly Twineham is no exception. The school has a soft start policy which allows parents to drop their children between 8:30-8:45 to ease the congestion in the lane. We also have a drop off zone.

I am currently liaising with an expert in parking at WSCC about remodelling the area outside and remarking the zig zag and hatched areas.

I would kindly ask, once again, that parents take responsibility for parking safely and adhering to the highway code re not parking on the hatched area and reversing out onto the roundabout to ensure the safety of all our children.

Due to our risk assessment regarding the public right of way and staff supporting children with additional needs, there are no staff available to enforce this and we have been advised by the police that parents take photos of anti-social parking behaviour and email Operation Crack-down. I would welcome any suggestions/ volunteers to help us with this on-going issue.

SEN

We are delighted that on Wednesday 31st January, Jenny Payne (our Early Help Link Worker) will be at school from 9am - 9:45am for a coffee morning. Jenny is an invaluable support to many families; this is the support she is able to offer: As your Early Help Link Worker, I can provide support and advice for children and their families when needed. By working together with our allocated schools we can highlight appropriate services in the community and make referrals where necessary. In my role I can offer help with worries and difficulties which you may have for yourself, your child or for your wider family and can help connect you to the right support at the right time whether this is through direct work or by offering guidance, information, advice, signposting and crisis support. Areas of support we cover are - Anxiety around school & emotionally based school avoidance, mental health, SEND and parenting support whether this is a one off meeting to discuss needs or a more targeted intervention.

Make sure your child has received the MMR vaccination

Routine vaccinations play a huge part in protecting us all against a range of unpleasant and often serious childhood diseases, including measles, mumps and rubella. Check your child is up to date with their MMR and other childhood vaccinations here: www.westsussex.gov.uk/campaigns/childhood-immunisations/ Older children and adults who haven't had both doses of the MMR vaccine could be at risk of measles. Two doses of the MMR vaccine are needed for lifelong protection and it's never too late to catch up on missed vaccinations. Vaccinations are offered free of charge in the UK, simply call your GP practice to book an appointment.
