How do we Assess our SEND Children? We use the ASSESS, PLAN, DO, REVIEW



CYCLE

All schools in the UK have to follow the Assess, Plan, Do, Review Cycle which is explained in the visual above.

At Twineham School, we follow this cycle and create Individual Learning Plans which identify targets to help Teachers identify key areas for the children to work on. The School* reviews these targets three times a year, in October, February and June. If a child has an Education Health Care Plan or Speech and Language Targets then these should form the basis for the ILP – but it we may modify, simplify or break down targets if we feel that the child may need time to achieve them. Our next ILP Review date is Wednesday 26th June – appointments will be scheduled shortly.

*We also enlist the support of external professionals to review and suggest new targets, such as Autism Advisory Teachers, Educational Psychologist's and Speech and Language Therapist.

Three vital skills for learning to read and write!



- 1 **Segmenting** - the ability to pull apart the individual sounds in words.
Example: pig /p/ /i/ /g/
- 2 **Blending** - the ability to push sounds together to build words.
Example: /k/ /a/ /t/ cat
- 3 **Phoneme manipulation** - the ability to insert sounds into and delete sounds out of words. This skill is necessary to test out alternatives for spellings that represent more than one sound.
Example: spelling < o >. Is it /o/ as in hot, /oe/ as in no, /oo/ as in to, or /u/ as in son?
