In Collective worship, we are learning about the Sermon on the Mount. Next week, we will be thinking about asking God in times of need and connecting with Harvest. Matthew 5:3


Harvest Festival —23rd October

Oakwood Church visit

Here is a write up from some of Oakwood class—

At the church, we met Reverend Rachel and she told us about the reason the signs that say people's names were there; they were either rich or important to the church (like a priest). The boxes in church used to be for the rich and the poor sat quite far at the back. She also told us about what happens in a normal church gathering. Someone would walk up the aisle with a tall crucifix and two people would stand to either side of the crucifix with lit candles. A pulpit is a special place where you stand to make speeches. A lectern is where the bible sits and then the priest/reverend would read the bible. We all enjoyed learning about the different items in the church.


